



## Glove Box Checklist for Sheep Trucks

Please flag down the driver if there is an ill or injured animal on board a truck, if safe to do so.

### What To Look For - Packing of Animals

- Truck over-packed so that sheep cannot all stand comfortably
- Sheep unable to retract leg into truck due to overcrowding
- Sheep unable to retract head into truck due to overcrowding
- Sheep trapped under other sheep due to overcrowding
- Sheep too tall to stand without crouching
- Small sheep packed together with significantly larger sheep
- Long horned sheep packed with sheep without horns
